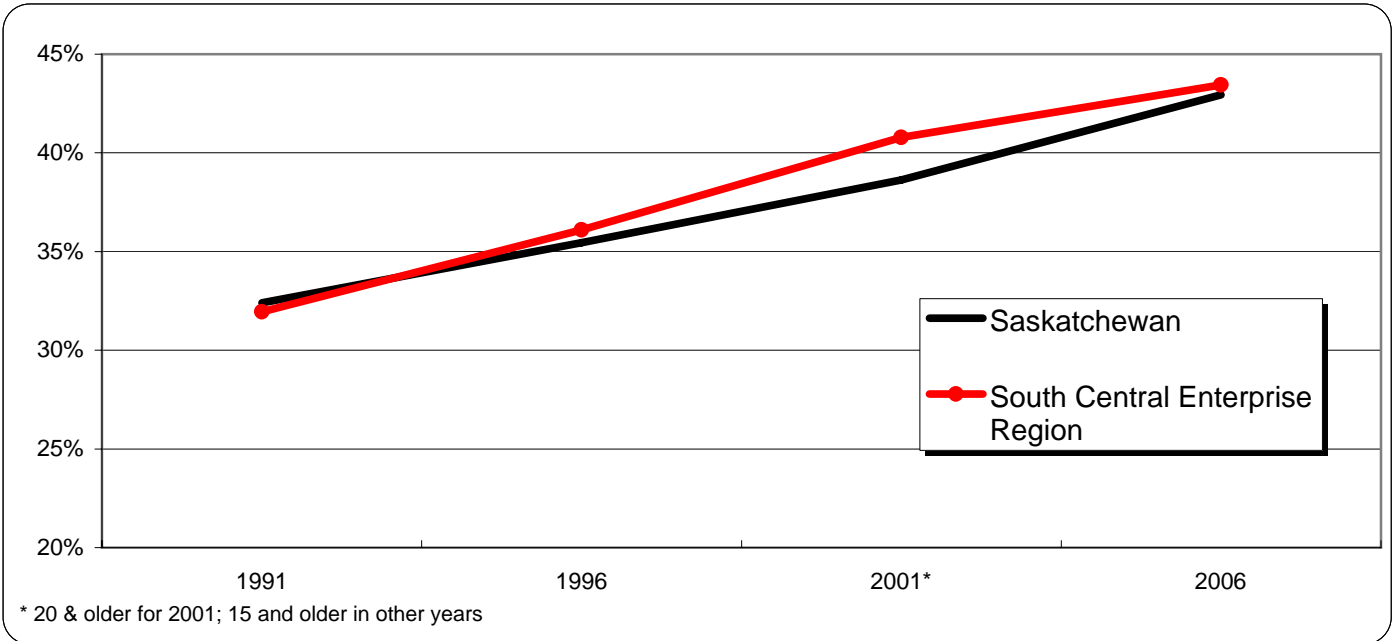

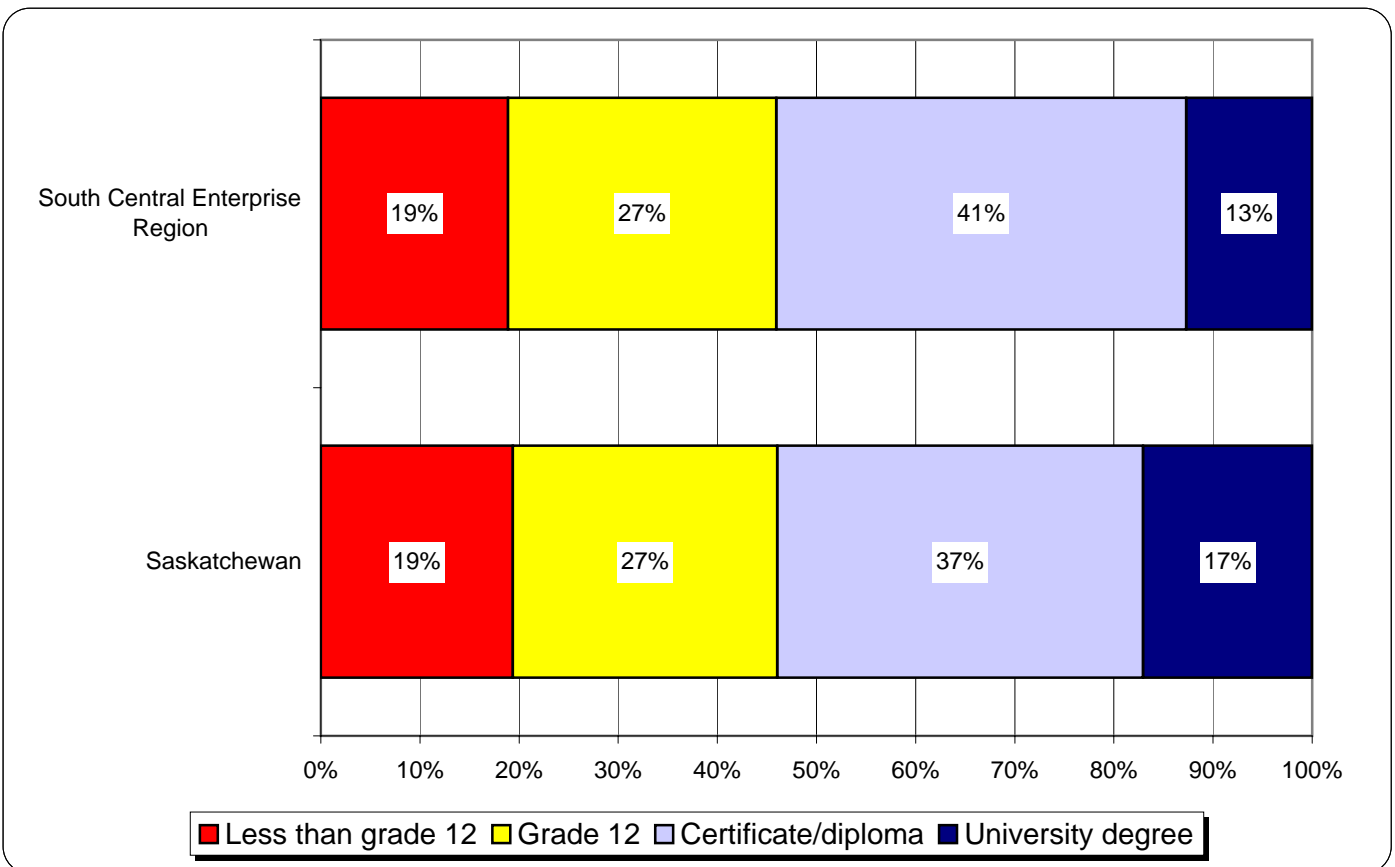

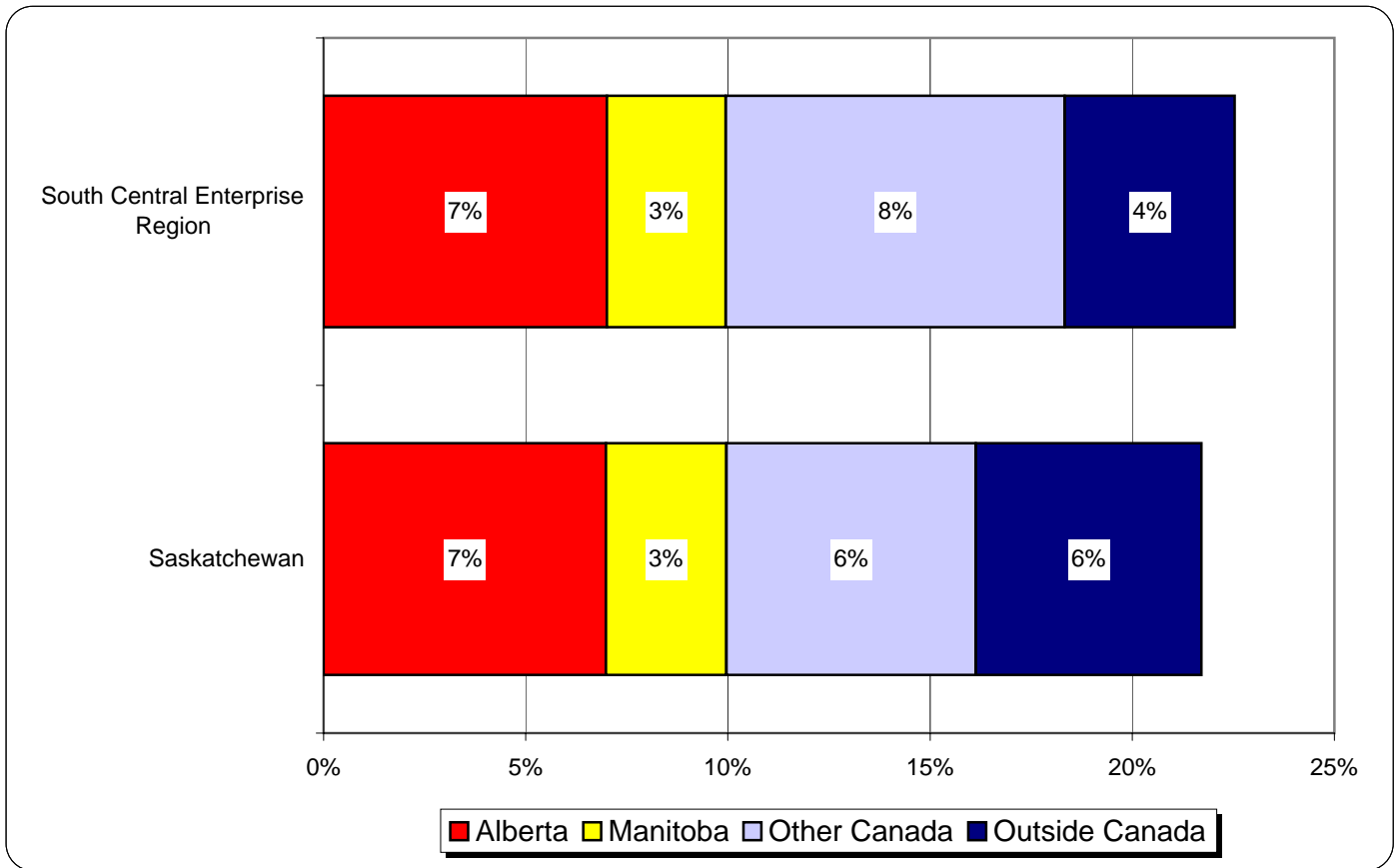
Percent of Adults with a Completed Post-Secondary Education



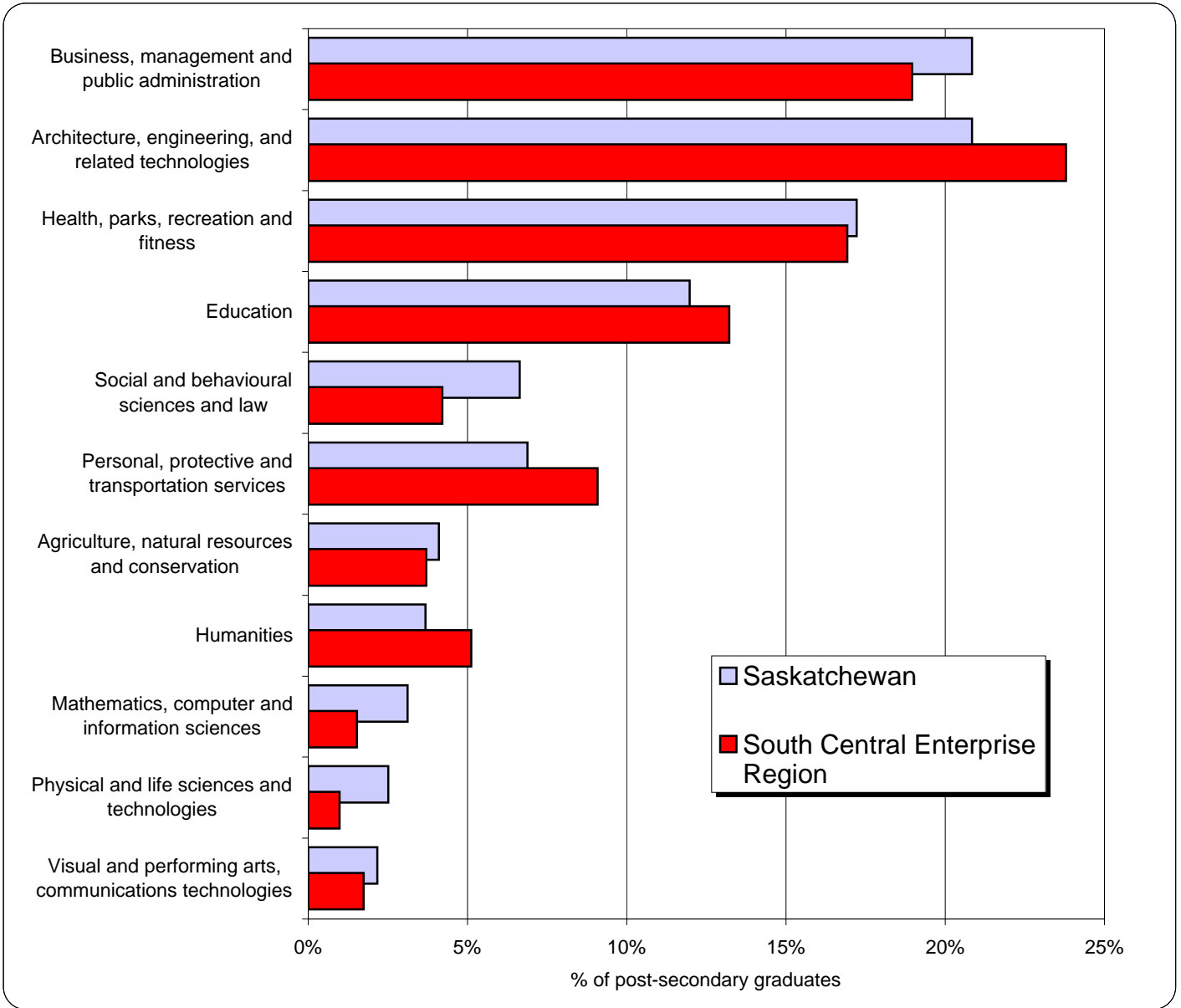
Completed Education, Population 25 to 64 years, 2006



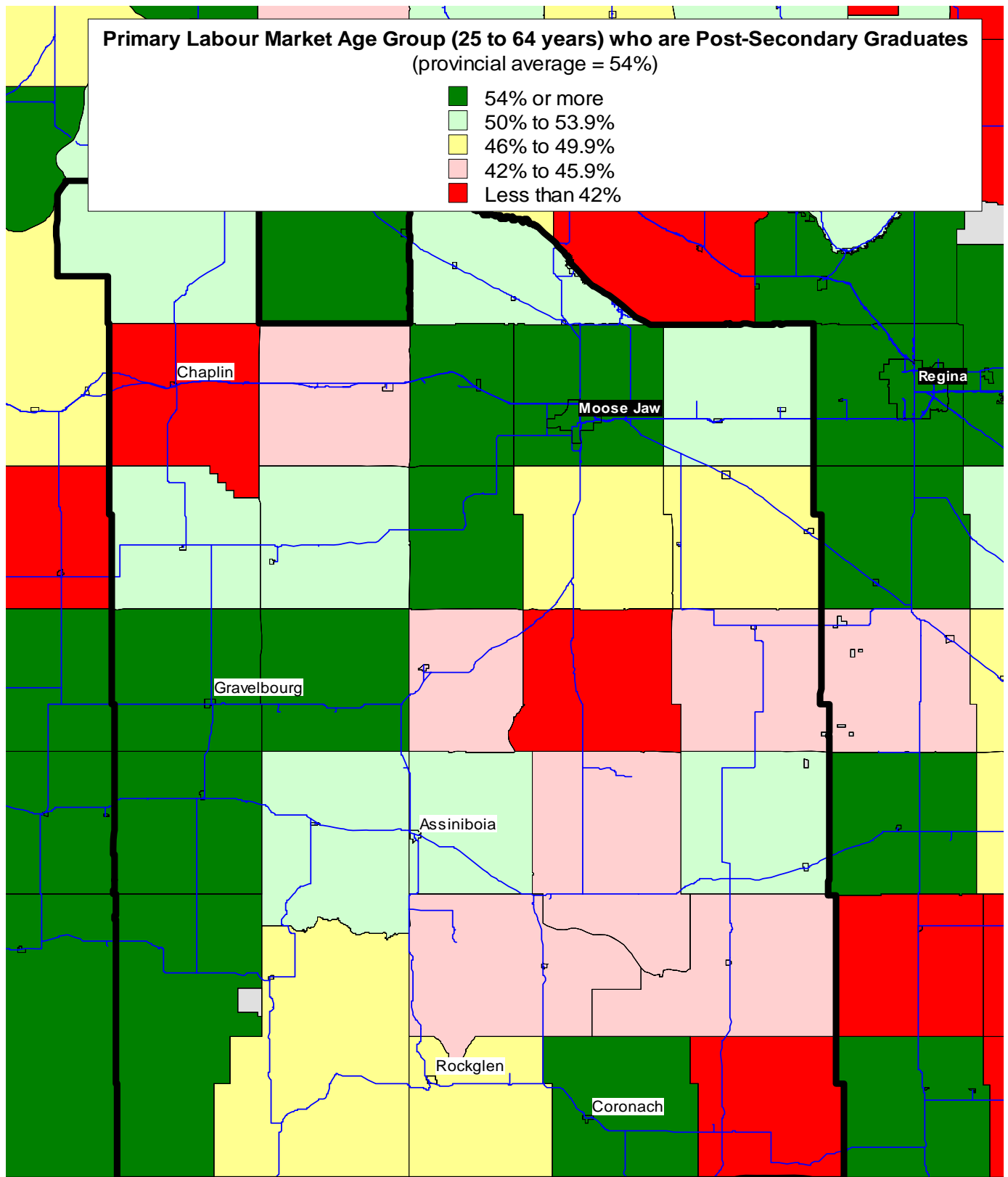
Location of Study for Post-Secondary Graduates, 25 to 64 Years, 2006
